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Credit Card Payment Processing Fee – Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the new processing fee?

A processing fee of 2% will be added to any tuition or fee payments made by credit or debit card. For example, if you pay \$1,000 by credit or debit card, an additional \$20 fee will be applied.

2. Why is the Computer Systems Institute charging this fee?

Merchant companies charge CSI fees for every credit or debit card transaction. By introducing a 2% processing fee, we can offset these rising costs and help ensure that tuition and fees remain as stable and affordable as possible for all students.

3. When does the processing fee start?

The 2% processing fee will take effect on 12/18/2024. Any credit or debit card payments made on or after this date will include the fee.

4. Does this fee apply to all types of cards?

The fee applies to all credit and debit card payments. However, it does not apply to ACH (electronic checks).

5. Are there ways to avoid the fee?

Yes. You can avoid the 2% fee by using **ACH (Electronic Check) method.** Available through our online payment portal, ACH payments transfer funds directly from your bank account with no additional fee.

6. Will I be informed about the fee before I pay?

Absolutely. Before you complete your payment online, the total amount—including the 2% processing fee—will be displayed. You will have the opportunity to review and change your payment method if you prefer not to pay the extra fee.

7. Is the processing fee refundable?

No. The processing fee covers the cost of processing your payment. Even if you receive a tuition refund later, the processing fee itself is non-refundable.

8. What if I have a scholarship or my relative sponsors my tuition?

The processing fee is applied to any payments that are made via credit or debit card. If your sponsor pays by a non-credit method (like ACH), then there is no fee.

9. Could the processing fee increase in the future?

CSI will review the fee annually to ensure it is fair and in line with processing costs. If it changes, we will notify students at least 30 days in advance.

10. Will my bank charge me a fee to send an ACH Payment?

Typically, most U.S. banks do not charge customers a fee for sending standard ACH payments to pay tuition or fees at an institution. ACH transfers are generally considered low-cost or no-cost options for making payments. However, it's always wise to check with your bank directly, as policies may differ. Some banks could charge a fee under specific circumstances, such as expedited transfers or business account transfers. If you have any concerns, please contact your bank's customer service for clarification before making your payment.

11. What if my payment transaction is returned?

Any failed payment transaction will be subject to a \$35 service charge.
